Our fabulous Gardener Mark Beckinsale and assistant Stefan began work on the East boundary of Courts 1 and 2 today. Turf has been stripped-off the entire length of both courts in preparation for that ground to be raised, there by correcting the significant slope-off in the direction of the pathway.

Also part of this project is the moving back of the access steps.

Please note that these works are being entirly funded by us, The Croeut Club - please do mention this to other members of the Main Club should the oportunity arise, to counter any misunderstanding.

25 November - Roberts retires as SCF Chairman after 10 years

Chris Roberts stood down as Chairman of the Southern Croquet Federation at its AGM at Winchester today. After 10 years at the helm, Roberts retired from the post to be replaced by Peter Allan of Blewbury. He was thanked for his time leading the area governing body (which, amongst other things, runs our league competitions) and was presented with a bottle of champagne by Federation Secretary Brian Jamieson.

Roberts recently took over from fellow Phyllis Court member Frances Colman as Chairman of the Croquet Association's Handicap Committee (Colman remains a committee member) and he follows her in leaving the SCF Committee to concentrate on the national role.

With the retirement of Roberts, and Colman before him, Phyllis Court now has Richard Peperell as our sole representative on the SCF Committee.

Mallet Maker Mike Percival attended Phyllis Court today for the convenience of members who, together with a few visitors from local clubs, places order for 17 mallets.

Phyllis Court Croquet Club also gain as a club from Mike Percival's visit, as he gave us two mallets as 'commission' following his first visit in the spring, and has promised us another one for this latest visit. These mallets which have longer shafts on request, are added to our cob stock for issue to our beginners each year.



15 November - Top National Award for Patricia is a first for our Club

I am delighted to bring you the news that, for the very first time, a Phyllis Court member has won a Croquet Association Most Improved Player Award - It's Patricia!

Patricia Mulcahy is the UK Most Improved Female GC Player of 2022

Huge congratulations to Patricia!

The award is judged by the CA Handicap Committee and awarded annually by the Crqouet Association

Statistically, Patricia has achieved the largest increase in international Ranking Grade of any female player in the World, and she is second over all to a male US player.

Patricia's prize is her name on the impressive 'Colman Trophy', a beautiful cast bronze and carvel wood piece, designed by Phylis Court member and artist Allan Henderson, commissioned and donated to the Croquet Association by our own Frances Colman. A presentation will be made in due course.

11 November - News of Court Improvements

Levelling

You may remember from previous AGMs, we have been building-up our financial reserves for a few years now, with the intention of undertaking some large-scale levelling work on our courts. One of the courses of action was have gone so far as to have had the courts laser-levelled and, as we reached the financial position that was becoming feasible, we sought advice from our solendid grounds contractor Mark Beckinsale.

With is expert knowledge of our location (gained from many years working on lands around the river), Mark has told us that the unstable nature of the ground beneath our courts, means that any overall levelling work would likely need to be repeated within five years, and therefore, a better approach is to address this with more localised and more frequent levelling applications. We will be undertaking a site levelling survey fairly soon, to map the dips and humps which will inform where raising and lowering are needed, before a first tranche of work is undertaken. I do not envisage that this localised levelling work will necessitate court closures other than by the occasional maintenance days here and there.

I will keep you all updated as progress is made with this.

Hopefully starting as early as next week (weather permitting):

Raising & Levelling the east side boundary of Courts 1 & 2 and repositioning of the access steps

The ground falls away markedly right along this edge (the one nearest the main PC building).

Members will know the difficulty in getting an even stance and having to hit up-hill from here, which doubtless contributes to the severe accidental damage inflicted in the start corners. For this separate project have engaged the tried and trusted Mark Beckinsale and his company who aim for completion by the end of November.

- Mark will pre-mark out a temporary new boundary line, making the courts narrower, and I will re-site the hoops accordingly, so that play will be able to continue throughout.
- The narrowed courts will remain set that way until the spring, so that the worked-on area is given time to bed-in and the (some new and some reused) turfs and seeding can take hold.
- A secondary likely gain could be winning a small amount of playing area as the bank is re-shaped but it may not be noticeable.
- Included in the project is the re-siting of the access steps back by the width of at least one paving slab way from the playing area, which will mean easier mowing for Mark and his team, less ball damage (hitting the sharp bottom step) and the elimination of our backswing collisions with the handrail that occur when playing out of corner 3 on court 2 So good news all round.

The first sign of these boundary works starting to happen will probably be the new painted temporary boundary line, or me moving the hoops further over than usual in the next few days.

Shortly, via In touch, Chris Hogan will be informing the PC membership about these works which are being funded entirely by the Croquet Club.

WINTER RULES

IMPORTANT - We are all going to have to be very careful with how and when we play in order to protect the courts, otherwise the facility may be withdrawn.

- No play if ground is frosty* you will have to wait for it to thaw please
- * treading on frosted grass seriously damages the grass plant (so don't do it).
- No play if it's waterlogged or there is Standing Water on any court
 - you will have to re-book for another day please
- No jump shots
